Dear Karli and Charles,

Thanks again for choosing Alaska Vacation Store for your visit to Alaska. I really enjoyed putting this package together for you, and I am sure that you're going to have a great trip.

This information packet has a number of items in it, and you should take a look at these just to make sure that everything is correct. I've tried to include everything that I can think of that would give you the information to "hit the ground running" when you arrive here in Alaska. If there is anything else that is missing or that you can think of that would be helpful, give me a call.

First, there is a copy of your final itinerary, which lists all of the items booked for your trip. One important thing to note is that there may be some items listed in the itinerary for information purposes, but we did not purchase or reserve these items for you (nor did you pay for them). These are listed as "client booked" items. If you have any questions about these items, please feel free to call or email your questions to me.

Second, for every item in the itinerary there is a "Venue Information Page and Voucher". This page provides you information about the lodging or activity that we have reserved for you, including the driving directions and contact information for the vendor. Some vendors request that you contact them in advance, so it is a good idea that you review the itinerary and Venue Information Pages each day to make sure that you have everything you need for your next day. All of your reservations have already been paid for by the time you arrive, but some vendors may ask you to either see or to keep this page as a voucher for your visit.

Third, I have included a number of pages with maps and descriptions of the roads you will be driving to assist you in navigating around the state. One thing that many people note about Alaskan road maps is that there is very little detail on the maps. However, the maps do indeed show all of the major roads in the state, but there just are not very many of them. These maps should be just fine to get you from town to town. They may be lacking a bit of detail in the urban areas

around Anchorage, but the driving directions listed on the Venue Information Pages should be of help. If you're planning to do a lot of driving around Anchorage itself, and you need city street-level detail, there are Anchorage maps available at the local grocery stores.

Lastly, many vendors provide us with brochures for their properties and tours, and when we have them, we include those with the final packet. Also, you can find the URL for the vendor's web pages on the final itinerary.

A word on delays: You will note on your Venue Information Sheets that there is a time listed for most of the items on your trip. For most lodging items, this is the check-in time for the place you're staying. However, occasionally we adjust these times in order to provide the vendor with an expectation of your arrival time. Where we have adjusted these times, they are estimates that I have made when planning and confirming your itinerary. These times may or may not be an accurate representation of the actual time you will arrive, especially when traveling between towns. In the event that you arrive early in a particular location, please understand that your room may not be available for check-in until the stated time. In the event that an early check-in is needed or required, we can arrange this for you if it is possible, and your itinerary and voucher documents will reflect this.

For tours or activities, the times listed on your vouchers and itineraries are the starting time scheduled for that vendor, and some of these require an advance check-in. If you anticipate any delays in arrival for any of your tours or lodging, you should call ahead and let the host know. The host's telephone number is listed on the Venue Information Page for that host. If you are unable to reach the host, you should contact me at Alaska Vacation Store, at (877) 692-5275, or (907) 334-2888.

In the event that you are delayed in your arrival, in a few cases (but not all), you may be able to reschedule your tour or activity. However, the tour provider generally plans on your arrival based on the time listed. If you are not at the venue for the start of your tour, and you have not contacted the host, you will be considered a no-show, and the host is not obligated to accommodate you at a later time.

Many guests ask whether cellular phones work in Alaska. In most areas that you visit, the answer is yes. There are some notable coverage gaps in some areas, depending on your cellular provider. However, there are very few gaps (at least on the road system) where

you cannot reach emergency services by dialing 911. I suggest that if you have a cellular phone, that you bring it with you, even if you leave it turned off during your stay. This will allow you to contact emergency services, or vendors and innkeepers in the case of delays. If you bring your cellular phone with you, you may want to give me the telephone number so that if I should need to contact you for any reason, I will have a number to call.

Occasionally, we will get phone calls from relatives and friends wanting us to get in touch with our guests on their behalf while the guests are in Alaska. Unless you direct me to do otherwise, I will not give out your cellular phone number or any other contact information to friends or family members. While most family members and friends are well-meaning, we have no way of knowing in advance who can be trusted and who cannot. With that in mind, we choose to keep your personal information and itinerary confidential. You can waive this by letting us know which friends and relatives are authorized to have this information. This is stated in our privacy policy.

A word about cancellations: A number of the tours and activities that we have scheduled for you are subject to cancellation by the vendor for a variety of reasons. Most of these cancellations or postponements are for obvious reasons, such as weather or other conditions that make these activities impossible or unsafe. In the case where the vendor cancels an activity, we will do our best to reschedule your tour or activity, either with the same vendor, or with another vendor. Our goal is to make sure that you get to experience the things in Alaska you came all this way to see. In the case where we are unable to reschedule your tour or activity, you will be entitled to a refund for that tour. We will provide you a refund for the item when the vendor makes the refund to us. We will not process this refund until after you have completed your trip, on the off chance that we are able to reschedule your activity at some later point in your travels.

A word about car rentals: If we have included a rental car in our package, we will have pre-paid for the basic rental and taxes portion of the car rental. The car company will still require a credit card impression and/or a credit card deposit for security. Also, the amount that we have paid does not include costs for additional or underage drivers, late fees, insurance or damage waivers, fuel, seat removal and storage, child seats or any other additional items. If you want or need these items, you will pay the car company directly for these. Alaska law requires that drivers keep proof of insurance in their possession when driving, so please bring copies of your insurance information

with you to Alaska. Drivers that are residents of countries other than the United States and Canada will be required to purchase additional coverage for your rental, and this coverage is arranged directly with the car rental company at the time you pick up your car, and we have not included this cost in your package.

As a matter of policy, we have included four-wheel or all-wheel drive vehicles in your package. Please understand that while these vehicles are better suited to driving Alaska roads in the winter, they are not impervious to bad weather and bad road conditions. However, you will find that in almost all circumstances, these vehicles will provide adequate traction for your travels. Please consult the vehicle documentation for the proper operation of the four wheel or all wheel drive system in your car.

I am sure that there are a number of items that I have not addressed in this note. If you have questions, feel free to send an email or give a call. I would be more than happy to answer any questions you have.

Our guests regularly ask about places to eat while they are here. The good news is that in almost every locale that our guests visit, there are good choices for food. In some locations, these are basic, family or truck stop kinds of food, but in others, there are some very good restaurants that compare favorably with restaurants in almost any city in America.

Below is a list of our favorite places. We do not accept fees or other consideration for their presence on this list – they are here because we like them, and eat there ourselves. I would not hesitate to go to any of these places, and I do, when I am there.

Anchorage:

Moose's Tooth. 3300 Old Seward Highway, Anchorage, Alaska. 99503 Tel: (907) 258-ALES(2537). www.moosestooth.net. Microbrewery and pizzeria. A big favorite with locals. Excellent and varied pizza menu, and great salads. Ignore the full parking lot, the wait is usually short.

Orso and **Glacier Brewhouse.** 737 W. 5th Avenue, Anchorage, AK 99501. (907) 274-2739. <u>www.glacierbrewhouse.com</u>. Microbrewery and excellent food. These sister establishments are located next door to each other on 5th Avenue.

Snow Goose. 717 W. 3rd Avenue, Anchorage, AK 99501. (907) 277-7727. www.alaskabeers.com. Microbrewery and excellent food. Deck with views of Knik Arm and Mt. Susitna.

Thai Village Restaurant. 954 Muldoon Road, Anchorage, AK 99504. (907) 337-9559. Small, local restaurant with excellent Thai food.

Talkeetna:

Wildflower Café. (907) 733-2695. Located on Main Street in Talkeetna. Very good food.

Denali Park:

The Perch. Mile 224 Parks Highway, at Carlo Creek. (907) 683-2523. www.denaliperchresort.com. Excellent food at a very scenic location. South of the park entrance, and may be more of a drive than people are willing to make if staying in Healy (about 30 miles), but worth it. Good choice if heading north from Talkeetna in the afternoon.

Henry's Coffeehouse. Stampede Road, Healy, AK 99743. (907) 683-2863. www.earthsonglodge.com. Wonderful meals and coffee and espresso drinks. Will prepare bag lunches for trips into Denali National Park.

Fairbanks:

Two Rivers Lodge. 16 Mile Chena Hot Springs Road, Fairbanks, AK. (907) 488-6815. www.tworiverslodge.com. Excellent food, out of town a bit.

The Turtle Club. 10 Mile Old Steese Highway, Fox, AK 99707. (907) 457-3883 www.alaskanturtle.com. Prime Rib, salad bar, seafood. Very popular with the locals.

McCarthy:

McCarthy Lodge. (907) 554-4402. www.mccarthylodge.com. Excellent food in town in McCarthy.

Girdwood:

Chair 5. (907) 783-2500, <u>www.chairfive.com</u>. Local restaurant and bar with great food and plenty of atmosphere.

Just because someplace is not listed here does not mean that it is not a good restaurant. There are lots of good eating establishments in Alaska, but the places on list above are the ones that I am comfortable suggesting.

Highways Traveled: Seward Highway Anchorage to Seward. Total Distance: Total driving distance Anchorage to Seward is approximately 127 miles. Driving Time: Nonstop driving time under normal dry conditions is 2 hours and 30 minutes. Cities and Towns: Anchorage, Girdwood, Portage, Moose Pass,

Seward.

Potter Marsh: A freshwater marsh that was created when the Alaska Railroad was built. This is a favorite spot for bird watching. There is a boardwalk that takes you into the marsh. This is a favorite nesting location for gulls, waterfowl and other birds. Bald eagles are sighted here regularly.

Turnagain Arm: This arm of Cook Inlet continues east to the Portage and Placer Rivers, about 40 miles southeast of Anchorage. Turnagain Arm has many notable traits. Most important is the large tidal range and the mud flats. A typical six-hour tidal range is as large as 40 feet. Bore tides are seen frequently along the arm, and are generally visible as a wall or wave of water moving from west to east about 1-3 hours a negative low tide. This occurs about 12 or 13 days a month, with the largest bore being seen around the full and new moons. Because of the sudden advance of water up the arm, the mud flats are particularly dangerous, because areas can become inundated by more than six



Beluga Whales: Beluga whales are frequently seen in Turnagain Arm. These whales are white as adults, and travel in pods. They can be seen pursuing fish up the arm. There are a number of places where drivers can pull off and watch the whales – These are also good places to watch bore tides. Large turnouts and parking areas are located at Beluga Point and Bird Point. In addition, there are quite a few smaller turnouts and parking spots along the way.

Waterfalls: There are numerous seasonal waterfalls that come down out of the mountains on the east side of the road. Many of these will disappear or become just a trickle by late summer.



Portage Glacier and Portage Valley: The Portage Valley is the gateway to Prince William Sound. The tunnel to Whittier is at the end of the road, and drivers can drive to Whittier through this one-way, shared use tunnel. Traffic directions alternate to allow two-way traffic, and the tunnel is closed several times a day to allow the Alaska Railroad to run through the tunnel. This area is a part of the Chugach National Forest, and there are many Forest Service facilities in the valley. The Begich-Boggs visitor center has displays and programs about the glacier and the Chugach National Forest. There are also several campgrounds, and a salmon viewing area at Williwaw Creek, where you can see pink and silver salmon spawning in August.

Turnagain Pass: You will climb a long grade up to Turnagain Pass. This is a very pretty alpine area that is popular with snowmachiners (snowmobilers). There are parking areas and turnouts in the pass. This area is subject to avalanches in the winter, and you will notice that there are signs and barricades that warn of avalanche danger.

Chugach National Forest: A good portion of the trip through the Kenai Peninsula will be through the Chugach National Forest. There are many trails and National Forest facilities, including campgrounds, parking areas and interpretive sites along the way. Take your time while traveling in the area and stop and enjoy these facilities.

Hope: The town of Hope is located on the south shore of Turnagain Arm, and can only be reached via the Hope road. This town is a bit off the beaten path, and has only a few guest facilities.

The 'Y': The junction of the Seward and Sterling Highways. Travelers headed to Seward will stay on the main road and continue south to Seward. Travelers to Cooper Landing, Soldotna, Kenai and Homer will head west on the Sterling Highway.

Tern Lake: Parking and interpretive displays at the lake, just south of the 'Y'.

Kenai Lake: The lake has a spectacular blue color. This is a very pretty lake in a fantastic setting.

Exit Glacier: Turn west onto Exit Glacier road and visit Exit Glacier. Short trail up to the glacier allows you to get right up next to the glacier itself.

Seward: The town of Seward is at the head of Resurrection Bay. Seward hosts a large July 4th celebration, which includes the Mount Marathon Race, which attracts extreme athletes from around the world.

Alaska SeaLife Center: This is an animal rehabilitation center on the shores of Resurrection Bay. There are several programs available to visitors. The most popular is the self-guided tour.

Highways Traveled: Glenn Highway from Anchorage to Palmer exits, Parks Highway from Palmer to Sunshine. Talkeetna Spur Road from Sunshine to Talkeetna

Total Distance: Total driving distance from Mile 0 Glenn Highway (Anchorage) to Talkeetna is approximately 115 miles. **Driving Time:** Nonstop driving time

under normal dry conditions is 2 hours and 30 minutes.

Cities and Towns: Anchorage, Eagle River/Chugiak, Wasilla, Houston, Willow, Sunshine and Talkeetna




Eklutna: Eklutna Indian Village – Stop and see the Athabaskan – Russian Orthodox cemetery. The Athabaskans construct brightly colored "spirit houses" on the graves of their deceased, so that the spirits will have a place to reside after death. Tours are given throughout the day. Turn west at the Eklutna exit from the Glenn Highway. Follow short distance to cemetery and church on the left.

Wasilla: Iditarod Headquarters and Museum – This is the headquarters for the Iditarod Sled Dog Race that runs every March from Anchorage to Nome. The headquarters has displays, trophies and memorabilia from the race, a small gift shop, and they run a 20 minute video about the race periodically through the day. Dog cart rides are available, weather permitting. Turn west on Knik – Goose Bay Road. At mile 2.2, turn right into parking lot.

Parks Highway Salmon Streams: Many of the larger streams that cross under the Parks Highway between Wasilla and Trapper Creek have active salmon runs during the summer. Some have foot bridges where guests can watch the water for spawning salmon. Among the better viewing areas are Sheep Creek and Montana Creek. Willow Creek is very good for viewing, but there is road construction in the area, and there is no safe viewing from the bridge. Access to fishing areas on these streams is often marked by brown signs. Streams are occasionally closed to fishing. Consult Alaska Fish and Game regulations to make sure that you are fishing in an area that is open.

Talkeetna: Mile 99 Parks Highway, turn east onto Talkeetna Spur Road. Follow for about 15 miles to the town of Talkeetna. The town is the starting point for many of the mountain climbing expeditions to Mt. McKinley and other Alaska Range peaks. A number of great activities are available in Talkeenta, including flightseeing tours and jetboat trips on the local rivers.

Denali State Park: One of Alaska's largest parks, the road travels through the center of the park from just north of Trapper Creek to near Hurricane. Several marked trails start along the Parks Highway. In addition, there are campgrounds and numerous turnouts and waysides where you can stop and enjoy the scenery. The Alaska Veterans Memorial is at Byers Lake (Mile 147).




Road Information Talkeetna to Denali Park and Healy

Highways Traveled: Talkeetna Spur Road, Talkeetna to Sunshine, Parks Highway Sunshine to Denali Park/Healy.

Total Distance: Total driving distance from Talkeetna to Denali Park is approximately 155 miles.

Driving Time: Nonstop driving time under normal dry conditions is 3 hours and 30 minutes. **Cities and Towns:** Talkeetna, Sunshine, Trapper Creek, Cantwell, Denali Park, Healy.



Talkeetna: Mile 99 Parks Highway, turn east onto Talkeetna Spur Road. Follow for about 15 miles to the town of Talkeetna. The town is the starting point for many of the mountain climbing expeditions to Mt. McKinley and other Alaska Range peaks. A number of great activities are available in Talkeenta, including flightseeing tours and jetboat trips on the local rivers.

Denali State Park: One of Alaska's largest parks, the road travels through the center of the park from just north of Trapper Creek to near Hurricane. Several marked trails start along the Parks Highway. In addition, there are campgrounds and numerous turnouts and waysides where you can stop and enjoy the scenery. The Alaska Veterans Memorial is at Byers Lake (Mile 147).

Hurricane Gulch: The Parks Highway crosses Hurricane Gulch, a 300+ foot deep canyon. Turnouts on both sides of the bridge allow guests to stop and view the canyon. Drivers should be careful when crossing the bridge. Pedestrians occasionally will walk on the roadway to look over the edge. Foot traffic across the bridge is strongly discouraged.

Honolulu Creek: A rather picturesque creek that crosses the Parks Highway. Notable about this creek is the canyon that feeds into the creek from the northwest. This canyon is very narrow and quite deep. A very small creek flows down the canyon, which drains from Mile 180 Lake about a mile away. Amateur geologists might enjoy a short walk to the canyon to observe the multi-colored cobbles and layers from the deposit of sediments.

Broad Pass: The Parks Highway travels through the pass as you approach the town of Cantwell. Most of this area is above the treeline. This is an excellent place to pick blueberries in the late summer and fall, typically from early August through September. There are spectacular views of the Alaska Range from northeast to southwest. This area is a popular area for snowmobilers in the winter, and the fall colors here are fantastic around Labor Day. Caribou are occasionally seen in this area.

Denali Fault: The Denali Fault crosses the Parks Highway just north of Cantwell near the first Nenana River Bridge, headed north. The largest earth-quake in the world in 2002 (Magnitude 7.9) occurred along this fault just 30 miles east of the highway here. Turnouts near this bridge allow you to view the river as it crosses the fault. You can see how the streambed has been displaced over the thousands of years from the relative movement across the fault

Carlo Creek: A small creek crosses the road here. One of our favorite restaurants - The Perch -- is on the east side of the road at Carlo Creek.

Denali National Park: Denali National Park lies west of the Nenana River from just north of Cantwell to near Healy. When you cross the Nenana River at Crabbie's Crossing, you enter the park itself. The park headquarters are near the north entrance, just after crossing Riley Creek.

Healy: The town of Healy lies just north of the park entrance. Many guests will stay at lodges and bed and breakfasts in this area.
